This program is FREE to all Prescott Valley residents.

# Hang up! Texting and driving could now bring up to \$2,500 in fines

The Town of Prescott Valley has joined other area municipalities in enacting an ordinance prohibiting the use of mobile communications devices while operating a motor vehicle.

Such devices include cell phones, personal digital assistants, laptops, tablets, computers, pagers, electronic games or other computing devices used while operating a motor vehicle on a highway or street (including being temporarily stopped because of traffic or an official traffic control device).

Drivers may use such devices if they are stopped at the side or off of the highway or street at a location where the vehicle can safely remain stationary, or

they are operating a device in a hands-free mode.

A law enforcement officer may stop a motor vehicle if the officer has reasonable suspicion to believe a violation of this ordinance is occurring.

Exemptions to the new ordinance do not apply to the use of a mobile communication device for the sole purpose of communicating with public safety, law enforcement, fire, rescue, or medical personnel regarding immediate criminal activity, safety hazards, or other emergency situations or use of a mobile communication device by public safety, law enforcement, fire, rescue, or medical personnel operating authorized

emergency vehicles for the purpose of communicating regarding their official duties.

Drivers will not be penalized for activating or de-activating a hands-free device before or after use.

Drivers who violate the new ordinance could face fines of \$100 for the first offense and up to \$2,500 for any subsequent violations occurring within 12 months of a prior offense.

The PV Town Council will have the first reading of the ordinance at its Dec. 6 regular meeting, followed by a second reading and adoption on Dec. 20. The ordinance will be effective on January 19, 2019.

## Smart conservation tips: Prevent Water Loss and Property Damage from Frozen Pipes

- Winter temperatures can freeze and crack water pipes if not properly cared for. Check outside your home or business for exposed pipes, water faucets and other fixtures that can freeze and break. This can include any outdoor irrigation systems made of PVC or metal pipes that are less than 12" deep. Drain and/or insulate these items for the winter months ahead.
- Drain your evaporative cooler and cover it for winter.
- Drain water hoses and store them in a garage or shed.
- Drain Irrigation water supply lines.
- Make sure you know where your home's water shut-off valve is and how to turn it on and off.
