Prescott Valley Police Chief, four leaders are now State Accredited Command Executives

Five leadership staff members of the Prescott Valley Police Department are now Accredited Command Executives sanctioned through the Arizona Association of Chiefs of Police. Chief Robert Ticer, Cmdr. James Edelstein, Cmdr. Jeremy Martin, Lt. Jason Kaufman, and Lt. Nancy Roberts have achieved the designation.

The Arizona Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ALEAP) Certification Programs directly encourage Arizona's Law Enforcement Executives to pursue a recommended standard for police leadership that is measurable and attainable. By offering proof of these standards to the ALEAP Commission, individual police leaders can attain ALEAP Accredited Command Executive (ACE) or Accredited Chief Executive-Advanced (ACE-ADVANCED) Certification status. The ACE and ACE-ADVANCED Certification Programs also will promote and encourage continued education through Re-Certification Program requirements.

To become an Accredited Command Executive, applicants must meet academic achievement standards of a bachelor's or associate's degree, and attend three additional executive level leadership training courses; must have command experience serving at the rank of lieutenant or higher for a minimum of two years or must be assigned as a sergeant with command responsibilities at their current police agency for a minimum of two years; and have executive level training such as the FBI National Academy, FBI LEEDS, or similar leadership development courses, and must successfully complete the Arizona POST Executive Leadership Program, and be an active member of Arizona Association of Chiefs of Police.

To become an Accredited Chief Executive, Chief Ticer achieved a master's degree, along with his police chief experience and additional executive level training. Chief Ticer also had to lead an agency that was accredited or pursuing accreditation.

Prescott Valley PD achieved its accreditation this month after a two-year process.
